HCCC YOUTH & EDUCATION PROGRAMS

HCCC Youth and Education wishes you a very Happy New Year. Our new session of our HCCC programs started off on a promising and successful note.

Our Library cataloging is moving at a fast pace and it would be few more months before we could start issuing books. In addition, we have been receiving books in large volumes from India and donors and to catalog and stack all of them does need effort and time. Our cataloging volunteers are working very hard to complete the task as soon as possible.

Meanwhile, you are welcome to visit the library. Come, read and enjoy the vast culture and knowledge of our ancient texts and thoughts of our Spiritual leaders. Also, we have a new librarian, Ms. Sarala who will be working on the weekends. Please stop by our library and say Hello to her.

Balajyothi classes had a wonderful start of a new session beginning this January 5th. We would soon be incorporating new Audio Visual programs in our classes. Our volunteers are working on the AV project. We would soon be having more exciting and fun classes with lot of eye-capturing images to enhance the classes.

The current topic of discussion for this quarter is Stories of Krishna and Vishnu, which is an excellent class to learn about the Life of Lord Krishna. The main motive for this quarter will be to discuss Lord Krishna's deeds and his goodwill for the upliftment of the human race and what we can impart into our lives.

In the first Week of February, the HCCC Balajyothi Program had an extended celebration of Sankaranti Festival. As the cultural celebrations, the kids in our Balajyothi class had a Kite-making class. While the participants make small kites as a hands-on project and as a take home gift, the parents along with the volunteers helped to make big Kites to fly. The exciting part of the whole class was to fly the kites. With the weather being perfect with fair winds, it was joyful to watch the kids having great fun flying their kites.

Other classes offered by our programs are progressing very well. GeethaJyothi classes led by Sri Murali Krishna Kalvapudi and Sri Vamsi Mudumba are one of the best classes for teens and adults. These teachers are well versed in Sri Vishnu Sahasranama and the Bhagavat Geetha. The class structure includes Isavasya Upanishad, Bhagavat Geetha and Vishnu Sahasra Nama. This class meets on every Saturday between 12 and 1 pm in the Library room.

Sri Murali Krishna also teaches Sundara Kanda Parayanam, a segment of Ramayana. Sundara Kanda recited as a parayanam (joint chanting or in the class) will remove all evils and confer all the dharmic wishes on us. Some slokas are said to have "Bija" aksharas (root letters). This Kanda as a whole is considered to have great Mantra Shakti and Sabda Shakti. This class is aimed at understanding the inner meaning of the text and to incorporate the teachings into our lives. Traditionally, if anyone wishes for something and recites Sundara Kanda, the wish will be fulfilled. This has been proven time and again. This class also meets between 12 pm and 1 pm at the HCCC center.

New Vishnu Sahasra Nama classes just began this New Year. The entire stotram chanting is learnt along with Guruparampara and Sri Lakshmi Ashtotharam. This class is held between 1 pm and 2 pm at the HCCC center and is being led by Sri Vamsi Mudumba. It is a good opportunity for new students interested in joining this chanting class to learn Vishnu Shastra Nama from the start. Sri Vamsi recites the slokas and talks about their meanings and what they imply and functions as a word.

Stotra Patanam is another sloka class, this is conducted by Pandit Nageswara Sastry. This class is dedicated to chanting of the magnificient Mahishasura Mardini Stotram, taught along with its meanings. This class meets on the Sundays between 1 and 2 pm.

The whole effort of HCCC Y&E programs is to bring back the glories of the ancient rich cultural studies to our newer generation. This is possible only with the dedication of time and ideas. We would appreciate it if you could donate your valuable time, money, books and/or advice.
