MINI HEALTH AND DENTAL FAIR ON 8TH MARCH 2008

HCCC Human services, based on the devotee feedback, planned to conduct health fairs semi-annually. The first mini health and dental fair for this year was held on 8th March, 2008. Dentists, orthopedic physicians, audiologists and general physicians participated in the fair. For the first time we had a state of the art heart scanning machine brought into the fair for screening the entire nervous system. The response for this scan was overwhelming and the physicians had to give rain checks for those who could not be scanned at the fair, so that visitors could get the scan done free of charge at the doctors office. The foot & ankle and audiology booths were another good attraction for visitors. The pediatric dentists and the adult dentist's doctors were also giving away stuff to the people visiting their booths and giving very useful tips on keeping up their oral hygiene. The Alameda diabetic in charge demonstrated the causes for diabetes and explained ways of preventing diabetes. The afternoon session consisted of seminars on Nutrition, diabetes, foot and ankle and pediatric dentistry. The seminars were well appreciated by all those who attended as they were extremely informative.

In all about 65 people took advantage of the health fair. About 40 people signed up for the bone marrow registrations which were done in association with National Marrow Donor Program (NMDP) volunteers. Our temple is one of the locations where NMDP collected huge number of registrations.
